Camp Connect Takes Over 110 Foster Kids to Julian

On Thursday, August 6th a record-setting 111 campers and 85 volunteers loaded busses bound for Julian for the 8th annual Camp Connect summer camp. This camp is a unique program that gives foster children that have been separated from their siblings an opportunity to reunite and spend four days and three nights with one another. With the support of Kevin Prior, CEO of ICW Group Insurance and one of our most loyal supporters, we gave these kids an experience to remember.

As the new Camp Connect Manager, I was eager to see the program in action. I was inspired by the campers' tenacity and amazed at their compassion for one another. While campers got to enjoy traditional activities like rock climbing, archery, horseback riding, zip lining, scrapbooking, music therapy, and singing, they also experienced something far more valuable: they fit in. For a few days, they were surrounded by other kids just like them, who know what it is like to be in foster care and separated from a sibling. The thing that set them apart most of the time was normal here, and they knew they were not alone.

As I made my rounds to each activity, checking in on everyone and making sure they were having fun, I asked each camper what his or her favorite part of camp was. One particular camper, who at first told me his favorite part was the mud pit, pulled me aside and said, "King Bee [my camp name given to me by the campers] I want to change my answer about my favorite part of camp." I said okay and asked what his new answer was. "King Bee, this is the first time since I stopped living with my dad that I feel safe, and I know my brother is safe with me. I love you for that." Camp Connect is truly keeping families together.

As fall approaches and students return to school, excited to start a new grade and move up to greater things, we too are excited by opportunities for growth and change.

Over the past two years, we have been fortunate enough to be able to grow two of our most impactful programs, Guardian Scholars and Camp Connect. Last fall, we doubled Guardian Scholars, awarding scholarships to 100 former foster youth. Camp Connect also served 20% more children through our four-day Sumer Camp and one-day events each month, allowing siblings separated in foster care to reunite year-round.

Even with these successes, we know that the needs of foster youth in our community are great, and we must continue to grow to meet these needs.

From time to time, we are contacted by other organizations throughout the region who are interested in Camp Connect. After eight successful years, our Board of Directors decided to expand Camp Connect into other cities over the next few years through partnerships with similar nonprofits.

For every two students who are awarded our scholarship, one is still turned away due to lack of funding. This is why we are working to build an endowment fund, so that we can help all of San Diego's foster youth achieve their dreams of a higher education in perpetuity. More information will come regarding this great effort to support our youth.

We will continue to grow, adapt, and change in the future, so that we can truly fulfill our mission to create a brighter future for all foster children in San Diego County and beyond. We could not do this without the help of dedicated, caring people like you. We thank you for your support, and we look forward to working together as we grow into the future.

Each summer Promises2Kids welcomes ten foster youth into the Junior Guardian Scholars program, each with a different background, unique personality, sometimes-opposite lifestyles, but each with one common goal – to graduate high school and attend college. For most foster youth, high school is a difficult time in their life. They face the realization of exiting the foster care system and entering adulthood with little or no support. Emotions are high, feelings are mixed and some begin to experience a sense of self-doubt.

Promise2Kids' work is to inspire foster youth to believe in themselves and see their future and success. Last month, Promises2Kids took nine of our "Juniors" to San Francisco, where they toured several colleges, including the University of California, Santa Cruz, San Jose State University, University of California, Berkeley, and San Francisco State University. In addition, they were given a private tour of Google Headquarters, where they met with a computer engineer, were able to ask questions, explore the possibility of being part of this field, and of course...working for Google.

This was possible because of the support of our corporate partner, Southwest Airlines, who provided round-trip airfare for each student. This was a trip of many firsts! First time flying in an airplane, first time visiting a college campus, and for some, the first time riding on a cable car.

Thank you Southwest Airlines! Your generosity created a lifetime of memories for our youth and helped each one get one step closer to success.

The Something Special Fund provides additional funds to make foster children's wishes come true. We receive all kinds of requests from football gear and class rings to music lessons. A.B. AND JESSIE POLINSKY CHILDREN'S CENTER
An emergency shelter for children who are removed from their homes due to abuse and neglect, this facility protects and cares for nearly 2,000 children a year.

CAMP CONNECT A program that reunites sisters and brothers who are separated in the foster care system through a four-day, residential summer camp and 10 additional day events throughout the year.

GUARDIAN SCHOLARS
A program that, beginning in high school, works with foster youth to ensure they graduate from high school, advance to college, and complete their higher education.

FOSTER FUNDS
Foster children often feel alone and isolated and may go without simple pleasures of childhood such as birthday gifts, a sports uniform or a musical instrument. Promises2Kids

has special funds set up to support these needs not met through typical funding.


Back To School

Guardian Scholars Awards Reception 2015

In June, Promises2Kids enjoyed another outstanding Guardian Scholars Awards Reception, held at the beautiful Del Mar Country Club. The event was well attended by over 130 students, mentors, Promises2Kids donors and supporters, including our sponsor, Mission Federal Credit Union.

This year, we celebrated 15 Guardian Scholars as they reached their goal of becoming college graduates. We also welcomed our new class of 100 students, which is our largest award class since Guardian Scholars began with 10 students in 2001.

Nationally only about 50% of foster youth graduate high school and less than 3% graduate college. Promises2Kids Guardian Scholars has an 80% success rate – our students are staying in school and graduating.
