Soon all of his siblings followed suit, hopped on a scooter, and put on their helmets. The youngest sibling, Vivian, was too afraid to get on a scooter alone. However, with her sibling's encouragement and support, she was soon riding her scooter alongside her brothers and sisters.

Once at the park, they rode their scooters on the skate ramps. They were stopping themselves by jumping off the scooter, until Jacob taught them how to use their brakes.

## Meet Guardian Scholar, Makayla!



As long as I can remember, I was always defined as a "foster child," besides all of the other names that came with that territory. I always had to be emotionally mature and take on the responsibilities of an adult, looking out for my siblings and doing everything possible to keep my foster mother happy so we would not be split up.

At 16, I became a mother. I realized that I would have to work even harder to not become the names that would play in my head from past failures. I was constantly put down by people who were supposed to be taking care of me and said they loved me. I began to believe the accusations that I was going to be just like my mother on drugs, or my father who hurt his only other child.

I can't erase the thoughts and memories of my past, but I know that I am above loneliness, depression, and anxiety. I was silenced for so long and just trying to get by. My turbulent childhood never allowed me the time to figure out my own identity, but that is something I am learning more about every day.

Thanks to Promises2Kids I feel like I have loving family support. They have been my light in the dark, and I am grateful for the support beyond my schooling, and the different opportunities for me and my children that would not have been there for me while I was navigating my life as a single mother.

I am proud to say that I will graduate next month from San Diego Mesa Community College and will transfer to San Diego State in the fall to be a better me.

## Gaining Confidence Thanks To You



Freya (13) is a foster youth who has suffered neglect and rejection that no child should ever have to experience. After her parents abandoned her, she moved around from home to home, not knowing what stability was. She lived with different aunts, uncles, and grandparents, all of whom decided that they didn't want to take care of her. Eventually, no one else in her family was willing to take her in, resulting in her being turned over to Child Welfare Services.

Freya struggles with self-worth and confidence. She is eager to please those around her and is often afraid that she will be sent away again.

When she was first placed with her foster parents, she expressed an interest in the Scouts BSA program. After attending the day portion of a camping troop for the local all-girls BSA troop, she loved it!

Thanks to generous supporters, Promises 2Kids was able to buy her a tent, hiking boots, camping and canoeing gear, and more so she could participate in the troop!

Freya still struggles to believe that others could love her, but this experience and the help she received has begun to change that. Slowly but surely, she is coming out of her shell and forming bonds with girls in her troop. She continues to gain confidence in Scouts BSA, thanks to help from people like you!
