Message From The CEO: Forever In Our Hearts

It is with great sadness that we at Promises2Kids are mourning the loss of beloved Jeannie Rivkin. Jeannie, a dedicated and compassionate advocate for children's well-being, and many other community needs, passed away at the age of 94. She and her late husband Arthur (Art) devoted their lives to making a positive impact on the community and specifically at Promises2Kids, positively impacting tens of thousands of children who had been victims of abuse or neglect, leaving a lasting legacy of kindness and generosity.

Jeannie Rivkin was known not only for her remarkable philanthropic endeavors but also for her warm heart, and unwavering commitment to the welfare of children in need. Her selfless dedication to creating a brighter future for the youngest members of our community touched the lives of many and inspired those around her.

Jeannie and Art made the lead gift of \$5 million to build San Diego's emergency shelter for abused and neglected children, the Polinsky Children's Center, which opened in 1994, and is named in honor of Jeannie's parents A.B. & Jessie Polinsky. Since its opening, this safe haven has cared for more than 60,000 children in crisis.

Through her tireless efforts, foster children and youth in our community have benefitted, Promises2Kids has flourished and became a critical support to children at the Polinsky Children's Center and the thousands of current and former foster youth each year in need of educational support, mentoring and other services.



Jeannie would always ask about the children and talk about how much it meant to her personally, to know that they received the help they needed. Her kindness and empathy were felt by every child who crossed her path, leaving an indelible mark on their lives.

I have known Jeannie for nearly 20 years and was inspired by her strength, kindness and compassion and loved her sense of humor and that she always had positive outlook. She was a friend to many and inspiration to even more than she knew.

Jeannie leaves behind a community transformed by her philanthropic contributions. Her legacy will continue through the countless lives she touched, the smiles she brought to the faces of children, and the positive change she championed. Her impact will be remembered not only through the tangible improvements in the lives of those she assisted but also in the hearts of all who were fortunate enough to know her.

Jeannie's beloved sons, Robert and Mike have requested that in lieu of flowers, that donations be made to Promises2Kids in Jeannie's memory.

She will be deeply missed, but never forgotten.



Being part of the Black Group has allowed me to open up with others who are a part of my race and can relate to me. Everyone



is so kind and I love that everyone keeps it real. This means a lot to me because it's hard to find people who come from the same background as me and can be genuine.

I have connected with a mentor named Maya. She has taught me about entrepreneurship and the responsibilities and outcomes of owning a business. This has really impacted me because I want to eventually own a business, and hearing from someone who comes from the same background is amazing and motivational. She is very caring, easy to talk to, and is always willing to answer my questions related to owning a business. On top of that, I've been able to talk about my ethnicity and where I come from, and this group is like another family.

I joined Promises2Kids in 2018. I'm currently studying Electrical Engineering with a minor in Naval Science and Mathematics at the University of San Diego. I decided to join the Men's Leadership Network, and the mentors I have are a great resource and an amazing connection.

Mentors take the time to check in and truly care about the journey that I am on and the passions that I am pursuing. They help me get out of my comfort zone and become more comfortable with speaking to new people, larger crowds, or while under pressure. One way they help me develop this skill is by putting me



through a panel of mock interviews. It can be fast paced and gut wrenching but helps you get used to answering tough questions while nervous and under pressure. This was something I was able to use last summer when I flew out to Washington D.C. for a job interview. I really appreciated feeling prepared and ready to communicate with the interviewers instead of being worried I would freeze up. This group along with the mentors who run it offer up a lot of knowledge and practical skills.

Gabby is sweet, caring, kind, respectful, and has supported me through so much, especially when it comes to my education and successes in life. I'm thankful for her helping me through situations where I didn't believe in myself. We enjoy every moment and absolutely love going to



Disneyland together for therapy sessions with Mickey! I am blessed to have her in my life. She has made me feel valuable, capable of many more things than I ever envisioned for myself, loved, and cared for. Many of us do not have that in our lives. Knowing that I can turn to Gabby at any given moment for any type of support is a blessing.
